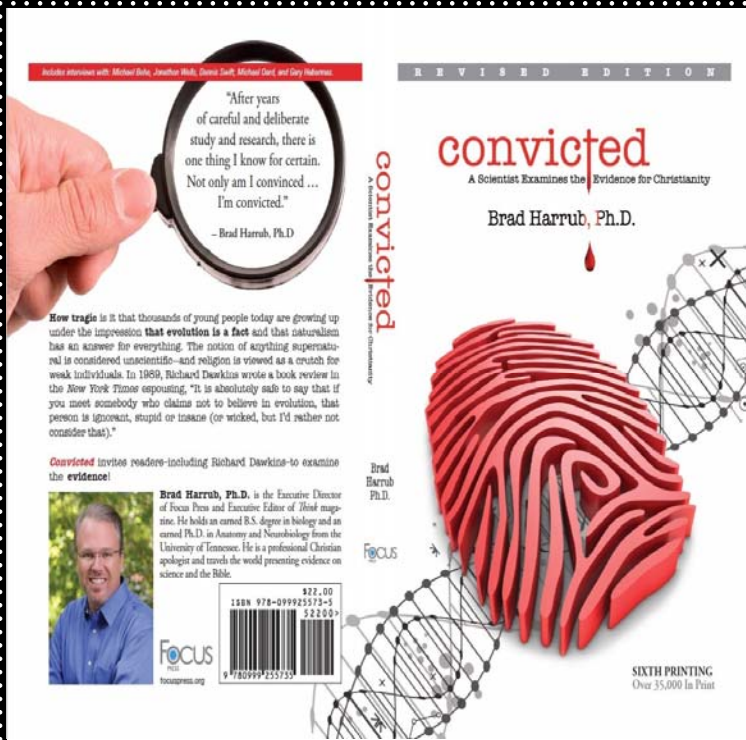

## THE STORY BEHIND THE PICTURE

*The Apostle Paul in his letter to the Romans, said in Romans 12:1-2, “I beseech you therefore brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God.” (NKJV) When I think about this text, I am amazed that most people don’t share Paul’s devotion to God based upon What God has done for us!*

*In the fifteenth century, in a tiny village near Nuremburg Germany, lived a family of eighteen children. Eighteen! In order merely to keep food on the table for this mob, the father, a goldsmith by profession worked eighteen hours a day at his trade and any other paying chores he could find in the neighborhood.*

*Despite their almost hopeless condition, two of the older children, Albrecht and Albert, had a dream. Both wanted to pursue their talent for art, but they also knew—their father would never be financially able to send either of them to Nuremburg to study at the Academy.*

*So, after many long conversations in their crowded bed at night, the two boys came up with a plan...They would toss a coin. The loser would go down into the nearby mines and, with his earnings support his brother while he attended the academy. Then, when that brother had finished his studies, in four years, he would support the other brother at the academy.*

*They tossed the coin on a Sunday morning after church. Albrecht Durer won the toss and went off to Nuremberg.*

*Albert went down into the dangerous mines and, for the next four years, financed his brother, whose work at the academy was almost an immediate sensation. Albrecht’s etchings, his woodcuts, and oils were far better than those of even his teachers, and by the time he graduated, he was getting nice fees for his commissioned works.*

*When the young artist returned to his home village, the Durer family held a dinner in his honor. After the meal, and all the fun and laughter, Albrecht rose from his position at the head of the table to recognize his brother who had sacrificed so much for Albrecht, and to acknowledge that he would live up to his end of the plan. “And now, Albert, it is your turn. Now you can go and I will provide for you”*

*Everyone turned to see Albert response at the other end of the table where Albert sat, tears streaming down his cheeks and shaking his lowered head from side to side, “No, no, I can’t, no brother I cannot go. It is too late for me. My hands are too damaged from working in the mines and I will not let that happen to you!”*

*More than 500 years have passed since then. By now, Albrecht Durer’s hundreds of masterful portraits, pen and silver-point sketches, water colors, charcoals, woodcuts, and copper engravings hang in great museums in the world, but the odds are great that you, like most folks, are familiar with only one of his works—you may even have a reproduction hanging in your home or office.*

*See, one day, to pay homage to Albert for all he sacrificed, Albrecht Durer painstakingly drew his brother’s abused hands with palms together and thin fingers stretched skyward. He called his powerful drawing simply “Hands,” but the world knows it as his tribute to his loving brother, “The Praying Hands.”*

*Friends, the next time you see this wonderful piece of art, please remember what God has done for each of us and let us live our lives like Albrecht Durer as a “living sacrifice”.*

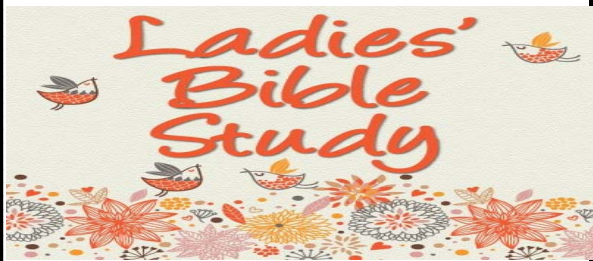
